

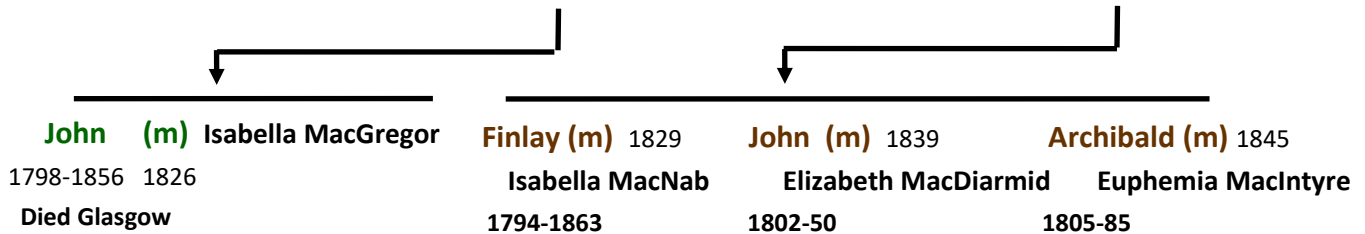
# DALMALLY MARQUIS FAMILY TREE

- 1685 – Patrick M’Varquis, died 1685, wife died 1691, son Archibald.
- 1689 – Finlay M’Varquise, died April 1689, wife Isobella, died Dec.1689.
- 1691 – Archibald M’Varquis, wife Eio Ilberrie died, Cattenish.
- 1692 – Malcolm M’Varquis, died 1692, children Niccoll and Ann.
- 1720 – Christian McMarcus, executed 1720, Inveraray.

**Nicol Marquis, 1834-98**  
 Nicol (shepherd) was the first recorded person to climb Ossian’s Cave (popular climbing spot in Glencoe) in 1864. His great-great-grandson still lives in Glencoe and works in the mountain rescue team.

Archibald and his family suffered a lot of tragedy. Born illegitimate would have been a hard start in life in 1865. Three sons would die in WW1 and a daughter died aged only 18. Even his own death was tragic, he drowned aged only 48.

Leon was born in South Africa and after living in various parts of the world he returned to South Africa with Euphemia in 1922. Four generations of the Plochot/Marquis family have now lived in South Africa.

Euphemia became a Scots/Gaelic folksinger in the 1920s and 1930s, under the stage name ‘Phemie Marquis’.

Both Ann (1909) and Catherine (1910) moved to Ontario, Canada, presumably to join relatives descended from Elizabeth MacDiarmid.
